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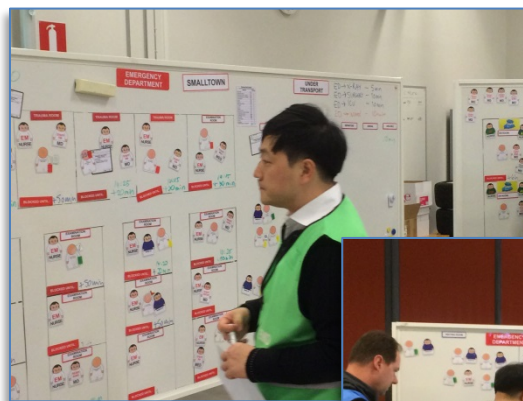

During 2016 there will be two international Senior instructor courses held by the ETS Competence center/KMC. More information available on KMC website www.regionostergotland.se/kmc ■

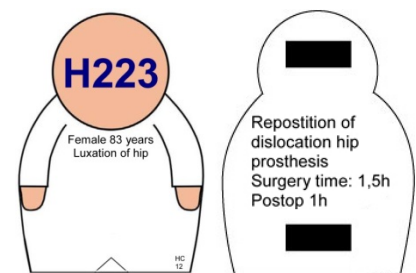


In-hospital patients for Surgery + in-hospital trigger patients

In-hospital patients for surgery

Today the Emergo Train System consists of intra-hospital patients admitted to the Emergency department and ICU. A request coming from ETS users was that different OR patients for surgery department was needed as well. A project has therefore started to develop H-patients for surgery department. Those patients are already in surgery or waiting for surgery when the exercise starts.

With this new material you will be able to include staff normally working at the surgery department. The exercise will be more fun and will facilitate the learning process better for personnel in surgery. It will be possible to evaluate the decisions made at the surgery department and evaluate the management of resources on the surgery department in relation to trauma patients from the incident and the in-hospital patients waiting for surgery.



In-hospital trigger patients

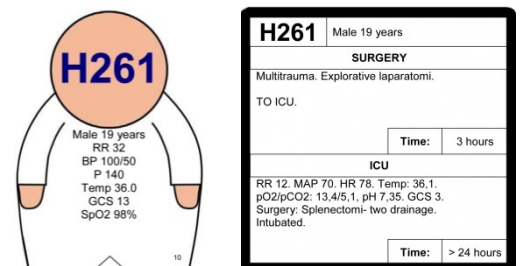
The in-hospital trigger patients can be used in two ways, depending on what the instructor like to visualize as a specific learning objective.

The instructor can use them

1. As a patient already admitted to the hospital placed on either ED, OR or ICU.
2. As an acute incoming patient that the instructor planned as a 'injected' intervention to make out some important points.

Some of the in-hospital trigger patients have severe trauma injuries with the need of surgery and/or ICU and can be evaluated by the already existing patient outcome categories. Others have a medical issue and can only be evaluated according to the H-patients categories (HC).

All this material will now be tested and evaluated with the help of ETS faculties in a number of exercises in Sweden, UK, Australia, New Zealand, Holland and United Arab Emirates. The material is planned to be available to use for ETS instructors in spring 2016. ■

Emergo Train System – summary of 2015

During 2015, 152 new Senior instructors were certified giving a total of 1 280 persons from 35 countries have participated in the standardized ETS Senior instructor course held by ETS Educator faculties in 7 countries. We are very happy to have the assignment to administer ETS and see it being spread around the world. During this year developments have been made to increase the use of ETS in-hospital exercises by developing H-patients for surgery department which have been a request from several instructors. We have also developed a standardized ETS instructor course for users of the ETS psychosocial material. These developments will be finalized in 2016.

Most important is the development and validation process of all the training material. All new training material and course concept needs to be tested and evaluated before we say it is ok to be named ETS and used in ETS exercises. During next year new projects will start and as always this requires a close collaboration with the ETS Educator faculties and Senior instructors around the world. Your input, ideas and comments are the most important part of future developments.

In July ETS Japan arranged an international ETS workshop with participants coming from six countries. The discussions on the workshop gave us valuable input for the future and it was nice to meet all instructors again.

We are very happy to work with and for all of you and would like to thank all the ETS Educator faculties and Senior instructors for this year and are looking forward to continue working together during 2016!
