International ETS workshop in Japan

On June 6 the third international Emergo Train System workshop were held in Toyama, Japan. The workshop was organized by the Emergo Train System Japan – Japan Disaster Medicine Education & Training Association. The workshop was held as part of the 18th Congress Japanese Society for Emergency Medicine.

ETS Senior instructors and Educators from Japan, Australia, United Kingdom, United Arab Emirates, Kenya and Sweden were participating on the workshop.

The day started with a member from each faculty or country (Japan, UK, Australia, UAE, Kenya) presented how ETS is used in their own area. The ETS Competence center presented new and future developments including a prototype of DigEmergo that was shown on a touch screen.

In the afternoon presentations were held about a paediatric data bank, new trials and ingenuities and hands-on training with a shelter management training named Happy and a digital triage training system. The day ended with group discussions about the future of ETS.

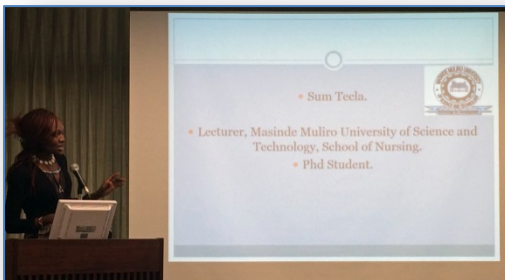

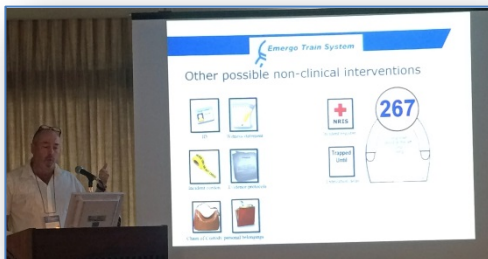

Exhibition and presentation at the WADEM

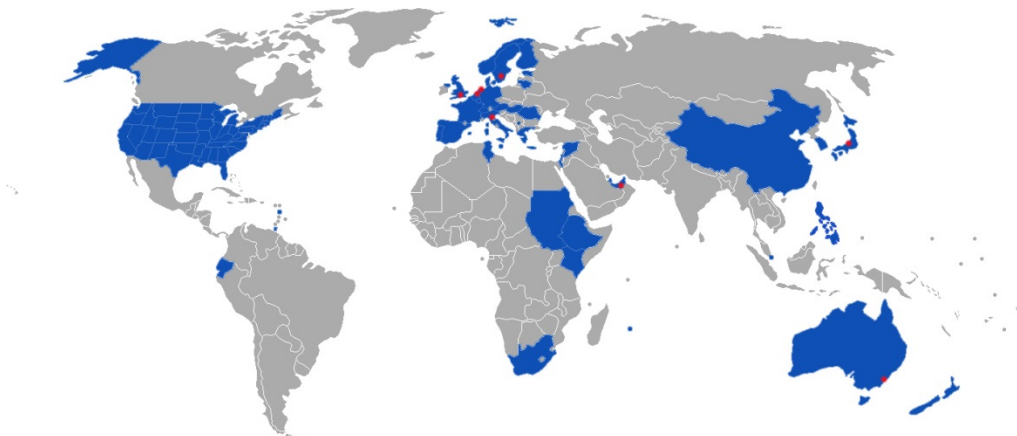
